#### TOPIC: WHY OBEDIENCE IS IMPORTANT TO GOD SCRIPTURE: 1 John 5:1-5

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Obedience to God means listening to His word and acting according to His will, demonstrating love and trust in Him. It is essential for a faithful Christian life, reflecting our commitment to God's teachings and authority.

From Genesis to Revelation, the Bible has much to say about obedience. The Ten Commandments story shows how important obedience is to God. Deuteronomy 11:26-28 sums it up: "Obey and you will be blessed. Disobey and you will be cursed." In the New Testament, we learn through the example of Jesus Christ that God calls believers to a life of obedience.

### **Obedience Definition in the Bible**

- Obedience in the Old and New Testament relates to <u>hearing</u> or hearkening to a higher authority.
- One of the Greek terms for obedience in the Bible conveys the idea of positioning oneself under someone by submitting to their authority and command.
- Another Greek word for *obey* in the New Testament means "to trust."
- According to the *Holman Illustrated Bible Dictionary*, a succinct definition of biblical obedience is **"to hear God's Word and act accordingly."**
- Biblical obedience to God means to hear, trust, submit, and surrender to God and His Word.

## **Obedience to God**:

- 1. Proves our love for Him (<u>1 John 5:2-3</u>),
- 2. Demonstrates our faithfulness to Him (<u>1 John 2:3-6</u>),
- 3. Glorifies Him in the world (<u>1 Peter 2:12</u>), and
- 4. Opens avenues of blessing for us (John 13:17).

Faith is necessary to please God (<u>Hebrews 11:6</u>). If our faith is genuine and authentic, we will live a lifestyle characterized by righteousness, modeling the example set for us by Jesus Christ. We obey His commands, not because

we *have* to, but because we *want* to and love Him. We are **enabled to obey** because we are remade once we believe in Christ and are saved. We are not the same people we once were. As Paul wrote in <u>2 Corinthians 5:17</u>, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!"

When we obey the Lord, we can live a life of joy, without shame, rooted deeply in the Lord and confident in our eternal hope. **"Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom"** (2 Corinthians 3:17). Our obedience is part of our **assurance** that we truly know God (<u>1 John 2:3</u>).

When God's children obey their Heavenly Father, He is glorified. Jesus told us that the plan is for others to **"see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven"** (<u>Matthew 5:16</u>). Of course, performing **"good deeds"** requires obedience to the One who calls us to good deeds. A Christian's testimony of holiness is a strong witness that God is at work in the world.

"Blessed are all who fear the LORD, who walk in obedience to him" (<u>Psalm 128:1</u>). The Bible often tells us that God blesses and rewards obedience. <u>James 1:22-25</u> says, "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. . .. Whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—will be blessed in what they do." See also <u>Psalm 119:1-2</u>.

God is gracious. If we haven't been living for Him, if we haven't been following His commandments, if we've been living in and for the world, we can be transformed by the blood of Jesus Christ. We can ask God for forgiveness, and He will give it. And He will choose to forget the sin, just as if we had never committed it in the first place. God is glorified when He extends forgiveness, because it is written, "I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds... Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more" (Hebrews 10:16-17).
